

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# THE LEWIS FAMILY

Living paycheck to paycheck, Jocelyn Lewis describes her living situation as a "rocky road." But despite her challenges of making ends meet while providing for her family, she has been able to somehow stay the course on that difficult road. "I don't believe in ever giving up," she says emphatically.

Employed as a BayCare hospital housekeeper for the past 15 years, Jocelyn has worked hard to live within her means and stay on her budget. The apartment that Jocelyn Lewis lives in with her daughter, Kateline, 15, and son, Lance, 14, has been a decent, practical dwelling that comfortably supports her family. However, the trade-off for a comfortable residence is that it requires more than 40 percent of her income, not including her utilities bills. A dedicated mother and dependable worker, she laments that she has been unable to afford the extra things her kids need. Tapping out each paycheck to pay her bills on time, she is forced to manage without a car, taking the bus to work and wherever she has to go.

Jocelyn is also challenged with regular rent increases that have been further complicating her situation. She has long lived in fear that her ever-increasing apartment rent and rising utility bills would no longer be sustainable for her income level.

"It felt like I hit the lottery when I found out I had been accepted into the Habitat program," said Jocelyn. Although her days have become more challenging as she adds her 250 "sweat equity" hours into her work schedule, she says "it will all be worth it in the end." She knows her rocky road will get much smoother when she relocates to Fuller Drive and the financial relief and stability that her new Habitat Pinellas home will bring to her and her family.
